NAQ Membership

Individual Membership

An Individual Membership provides full benefits to individual professionals. Membership dues are \$55.00 annually.



Organizational Membership

An Organizational Membership provides full benefits to an organization. Membership dues are paid annually and vary according to the number of participating employees chosen by the organization. The more employees enrolled, the lower the annual dues per person.

- 1 - 6 Employees = \$250
- 7 - 14 Employees = \$500
- 15 - 25 Employees = \$750
- 26 - 50 Employees = \$1250
- 50+ Employees = \$1250
plus \$25 per employee
